Residential Recycling Options

Residents within the cities should use city-provided curbside recycling programs. People living in apartments or other multi-family residences, or those living in unincorporated areas of Rock Island County who do not have curbside recycling pick-up, may use the Waste Commission of Scott County drop-off recycling site at 5650 Carey Avenue, Davenport, Iowa, or the other five drop-off sites. Recycle These Items (rinse out food containers, flatten boxes)



Plastic bags may be accepted a grocery stores.

Do NOT put in recycle bins

- ✗ Batteries/CFL bulbs
- ✗ Construction materials
- ✗ Paint/oil/hazardous materials
- ✗ Plastic bags
- ✗ Pizza boxes or anything with food remains
- ✗ Rigid plastic containers – Laundry baskets, toys, etc.
- ✗ Styrofoam
- ✗ Tires
- ✗ Toasters/small appliance
- ✗ Waxed/coated bags or paper

Glass

Check with your city to see if glass is accepted in curbside bins. Waste Commission of Scott County accepts glass bottles and jars at their drop-off sites.

White Goods and Used Tire Collection Program

Weikert Iron and Metal Recycling collects and disposes of old appliances and residentially generated tires, with rims removed, at **no charge** to Rock Island County residents. Please call **1-877-934-5378** or visit www.weikertrecycling.com for more information and to make an appointment.



Appliances: Limit is four (4) large appliances per household per year.

Tires: Limit is ten (10) tires per household per year.

Small appliances: Items like blenders, toasters, vacuums, hair dryers, mixers, and electric razors, and toothbrushes should be **deposited in your regular trash**.

Curbside Recycling and Garbage Services

Curbside recycling and garbage services are handled by each individual community. **For questions about regularly-scheduled, bulky waste*, or yard waste pick-ups, please contact the public works department for the community of residence.** For contact information, please visit www.ricwma.org.

* Bulky waste is defined as items prohibited in the regular garbage container, such as carpeting and furniture, but not e-waste or household hazardous waste.
